To what extent are current societal events likely to affect future household / commercial financial vulnerability, using CCJs as a proxy for indebtedness

Short description of the problem that would be addressed by the project:

The use of County Court Judgments (CCJs) as a measure of indebtedness across the UK and Ireland allows the analysis and interpretation of patterns of financial vulnerability across space and time. Using predictive analysis, Registry Trust are interested in how current social or economic events will influence commercial (business) or household level finances and quality of life in the future.

This project allows the student to investigate a current societal events and, using data, predict the events' influence on future finances.

Registry Trust judgment data:

- Geographical scales: local authority, electoral ward, LSOA, MSOA and OA
- Date: 2001 to 2021
- Breakdown: Consumer, corporate, non-corporate, and commercial (corporate and non-corporate combined)
- Information provided: Number of judgments, total value, average value, value breakdown
